### Pentecost Celebration

On the day of the Pentecost the Holy Spirit manifested Himself to the Apostles as of tongues of fire and filled them with Himself (Acts 2). This day is so significant that it is considered the birthday of the Church. Therefore, in honor of Pentecost Sunday and the Confirmation Candidates, there will be a parish wide celebration after the 10:00 AM Mass on the Feast of the Pentecost, May 23. At this event the parish will be celebrating with plenty of outdoor activities and food.

## Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations

World Day of Prayer for Vocations is observed on Sunday, April 25, which is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." This year, 2021, marks the 58th Anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this special day is to publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, this day affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the *ordained ministries* (priesthood and diaconate), to the *religious life* in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to societies of apostolic life, to secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the *missionary life*.

St. John Paul II said: And never stop praying for priestly vocations and for perseverance in the commitment of consecration to the Lord and to souls. But, above all, create in your families an atmosphere suitable for the flourishing of vocations. And, you parents, be generous in responding to God's plans for your children.

Today and always we must pray for all religious vocations, male and female, in order that this testimony of religious life in the Church may be more and more numerous, alive, intense, and always efficacious. Today more than ever the world needs convinced witnesses who are completely consecrated! Beloved Faithful, I conclude by recalling the heartfelt invocation of Jesus the Good Shepherd: "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest" (<u>Mt 9,37 Lc 10,2</u>).

Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, and societies of apostolic life or secular institutes.
