THE DAYS OF HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is the most sacred time of the Church year, inviting us to walk closely with Christ through His Passion, death, and Resurrection.

Palm Sunday marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and the beginning of His Passion.

Holy Monday & Holy Tuesday invite us to reflect on Jesus' final days of teaching and preparation, calling us to remain faithful to Him.

Spy Wednesday recalls the betrayal of Jesus by Judas, reminding us to turn away from sin and choose fidelity to the Lord.

Holy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, the institution of the Eucharist, and the priesthood.

Good Friday is a solemn day when we remember Christ's suffering and death on the Cross. It is a day of **FASTING** and **ABSTINENCE**.

Holy Saturday is a quiet day of waiting and prayer as we reflect on Christ in the tomb.

Easter Sunday celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus and the victory of life over death.

As we enter these sacred days, may we open our hearts more fully to the mystery of Christ's love and the promise of new life.
